These services are programs are described in more detail below.

Goodwill is also licensed by the NC Division of Health Service Regulation for the provision of day habilitation services.

Ability Services Program Overview

Ability Services provides assistance including job placement strategies to persons with disabilities. The services are individualized and include comprehensive vocational evaluation, employee development skills, and community employment services.

Program Description and Expectations: Comprehensive Vocational Evaluation

Comprehensive Vocational Evaluation includes vocational assessments, interest inventories, career coaching, and identification of career goals and training needs on an individual basis. It is expected that individuals completing comprehensive vocational evaluation will exit this phase with an individual vocational evaluation assessment report to help guide their next program steps either within Goodwill or through other referral sources.

Comprehensive Vocational Evaluation Services are provided by appointment and offered Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The service is offered on an ongoing basis to meet individual needs.



Populations Served and Referral Process

Comprehensive Vocational Evaluation Services are provided for individuals with disabilities that enter the Ability Services Program. Individuals may participate in the service based on a referral from the NC Division of Vocational Rehabilitation, Veteran partnership agencies, other community agencies, or by self-referral to the program. There are no fees to the participants in these services.

Program Description and Expectations: Community Employment Services

Community Employment Services are also provided under the umbrella of Abilities Services. It is designed to help individuals move into competitive employment in their communities. It provides the connection to employment opportunities and continued support after job replacement. The continued support is provided to help individuals retain employment and build skills after employment. In some situations, a job coach may be provided to temporarily assist a participant on the job. It is expected that individuals in this program will learn the skills to obtain and maintain employment.

Days/Hours/Frequency of Service

Community Employment Services are offered Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. However, other times and weekend hours may be offered to provide support for employers and participants upon job placement. The service is offered on an on-going basis to meet individual needs.

Populations Served and Referral Process

Community Employment Services are provided for individuals with disabilities that enter the Ability Services Program. Individuals may participate in the service based on a referral from the NC Division of Vocational Rehabilitation, Veteran partnership agencies, other community agencies, or by self-referral to the program. There are no fees to the participants in these services.

Community Integration Overview

Community Integration is offered as a day habilitation program to meet the individual's needs of adults with developmental disabilities. This service is licensed through the Department of Health and Human Services.

Program Description and Expectations: Community Integration Services

Community Integration is a day habilitation program service model. Based on individual choice, participants are involved in vocational experience, independent living skills training, arts and recreation, compensatory education, and community outings and events. It is expected that individuals in this program will achieve their individual choices and goals in these areas.

Individuals in this program are connected to an ADVP or CAP slot through the referral system. There are no fees to the participants in these services.
